Gardening by the Book

Night Gardens

While typical gardens are planned for the heat of the day, it is the quiet relaxed evening hours when most of us have the leisure to sit down and enjoy the rewards of our planting, weeding and watering efforts. Why not make the most of those hours in the garden, since we're free to enjoy our handiwork then? A garden that comes to life when the sun goes down can be planned and planted.

Not just gardens are vibrant after twilight. Creatures of the night, such as moths, bats, fireflies, and frogs, make their appearance then. Discover Nature at Sundown (Stackpole Books, 1995) encourages one to look, listen and smell to learn more. The reader learns of the lifestyle and facts of the animal. Activities are suggested which are of interest to any beginning naturalist. Both inquisitive adults and older children will enjoy this nature guide.

Evening Gardens: Planning and Planting a Landscape to Dazzle the Senses after Sundown (Chapters Publishing, 1993) provides guidance without a massive design effort. Over 150 herbs and flowers which release heady fragrances are given. Pools, fountains and structures such as walls, gates, arbors and steps are architectural possibilities. Unobtrusive garden lighting and light colored plants can guide us as we explore the garden.

From night-blooming cactuses and daylilies, fragrant orchids and wildflowers, a variety of plants are found in a night garden. A discussion of plants with night time value, whether fragrance, bloom, or the ability to attract moths, is

included. White flowers are described in a variety of gardens. The Evening Garden: Flowers and Fragrance from Dusk till Dawn (Timber Press, 2002) even has technical considerations such as how the eye sees color at night.

Scott Ogden's The Moonlit Garden (Taylor Publishing Co., 1998) offers inspiration and practical wisdom on creating a night garden. Developing mixed plantings of scented flowers for light-reflecting foliage and illuminating the garden naturally with pale stones are included in his suggestions. The concept of garden design including the placement of paths, seats and architectural structures can add to the enjoyment. A variety of night-blooming plants are showcased from various habitats.

For basic planting and design principles try The Twilight Garden (Ball Publishing, 2011). Chapters on night-scented and night-blooming plants, mood lighting, water features, enclosures and the use of color and sound to attract wild life are included. Using these planting and design features, this book helps establish a unique nocturnal garden.

The Tulsa Garden Center has two major fundraising events each year that would not be possible without hundreds of hours of volunteer time.

SpringFest Garden Market, the second weekend in April is a celebration of spring! This family-friendly festival includes anything you could ever want for your garden displayed throughout the Mansion and front lawn. The event includes food and entertainment for all ages. Volunteers are responsible for everything from distributing balloons to parking cars. **We currently have a few volunteer positions available for this event.**

An Evening of Wine and Roses is an elegant evening in the Tulsa Municipal Rose Garden the last Friday of September. Over 1,000 patrons enjoy quality wines and appetizers from Tulsa's finest restaurants, all this under the stars, while the roses are in full fall bloom. Volunteers really love this event. From set up to take down it is action packed!

Less labor-intensive activities include serving as a committee member to recruit new members, or joining the education committee and

helping plan upcoming classes, answering telephones, joining the Mailing Committee, or helping out with office work. All Tulsa Garden Center members are eligible to serve on our Volunteer Board.

As a project of the Tulsa Garden Center, the Linnaeus Teaching Garden is maintained by trained volunteers. Recruitment takes place each August. The volunteers are put through a rigorous 12-week training program and volunteer a minimum of 40 hours before they receive their Linnaeus Gardener certificate.
